Barrier-free is a legal requirement for buildings in downtown areas and large shopping malls. Even if there are steps at the entrance, you will find alternative access such as elevators or escalators. You will always find wheelchair accessible restrooms as well. Smaller multi-tenant buildings may have stairs only, with many steps and narrow spaces. But you can comfortably enjoy your shopping in some smaller individual shops where they have no steps.

Restaurants in the city area may have steps at the door, or it may be small and narrow inside. Traditional Japanese restaurants usually have old-style tatami mat rooms and are not barrier-free. Bigger and more popular restaurants are more wheelchair friendly, with slopes at the entrance and also with wheelchair accessible restrooms. Restaurants located inside multi-tenant buildings normally do not have steps at the entrance and the restrooms are located in the same building. Family restaurants in the suburbs target families, so many of them have slopes at the entrance, and have more space inside, and are also barrier-free. Some restaurant chains have wheelchair accessible restrooms in all of their restaurants. If you have any special preference in food (how you would like it cooked, restrictions in seasoning, or chopped food), ask the chef, and good restaurants will cater to your needs.

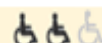

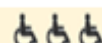

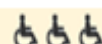
The world famous Electric Town. This district is a subculture hotspot for manga comics, games, otaku/geek goods and maid cafes. Most big stores are wheelchair accessible while many small stores in old small buildings have no lift. [Maid cafes](#) are generally tiny and very few of them have lift access. JR Akihabara Station is wheelchair accessible.

**Asakusa**[accessible photos](#)

One of the most famous tourist spot in Tokyo. Asakusa shopping arcade is popular. Although this street is flat, the shopping arcade is so crowded on weekends that wheelchair users may find it difficult to walk around in the street. [Sensoji Temple](#), which is well-known for the front gate called Kaminarimon, is wheelchair accessible. There is a lift on the left side of the main temple.

Stylish area next to Shibuya. It is very popular for local people to live, but expensive. Ebisu Garden Place (shops, museum, hotel, apartment) is the place for tourism. Many nice individual restaurants, cafe, shops and bars around here. Ebisu is famous as Sapporo beer company head office.

**Ginza**[accessible photos](#)

The most famous upmarket shopping, dining and entertainment district in Japan. Sidewalks in the area are very smooth. Department stores are fully wheelchair accessible. Excellent service is provided at many high-grade restaurants, bars, stores and night clubs. The nearest station is JR Yurakucho Station, which is wheelchair accessible. Metro stations have lifts, but the railway network is very complicated.

DisabledGo was founded in 2000 by [Dr Gregory Burke](#) who, as a wheelchair user himself since the age of 16, is acutely aware of the barriers which disabled people face when trying to access leisure, education, employment and services in their community.

The business was born out of Gregory's desire to break down these barriers through the provision of detailed online access information to a huge range of public places. The power of knowing that a particular venue is suited to your individual needs before leaving home cannot be underestimated.

Everyone's needs are different, and with this in mind, Gregory embarked on 2 years of consultation with disabled people across the UK. This in depth research identified all the types of information that would be required to determine whether a venue is suited to an individual's specific requirements. The result of this consultation was the creation of a highly detailed pan-disability survey template which our highly trained surveyors use when visiting the places they assess.

Our mission is to empower disabled people by providing independence and choice.

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The first online access guide was published in 2002 on behalf of the London Borough of Croydon. 11 years on they remain a highly valued client.

The last 10 years have been a period of rapid growth and DisabledGo is now the UK's leading provider of access information. Working in partnership with local authorities, universities, colleges, NHS Trusts and private sector organisations, we now publish access information to well over 120,000 places of interest across the UK and the Republic of Ireland.

Yet, whilst the business has grown significantly since the early days, we remain totally committed to our founding principles and particularly to our commitment to grassroots consultation. In this way we ensure that the access information we provide is accurate, reliable, consistent, user friendly and, above all, that it reflects your demands and expectations as a user.

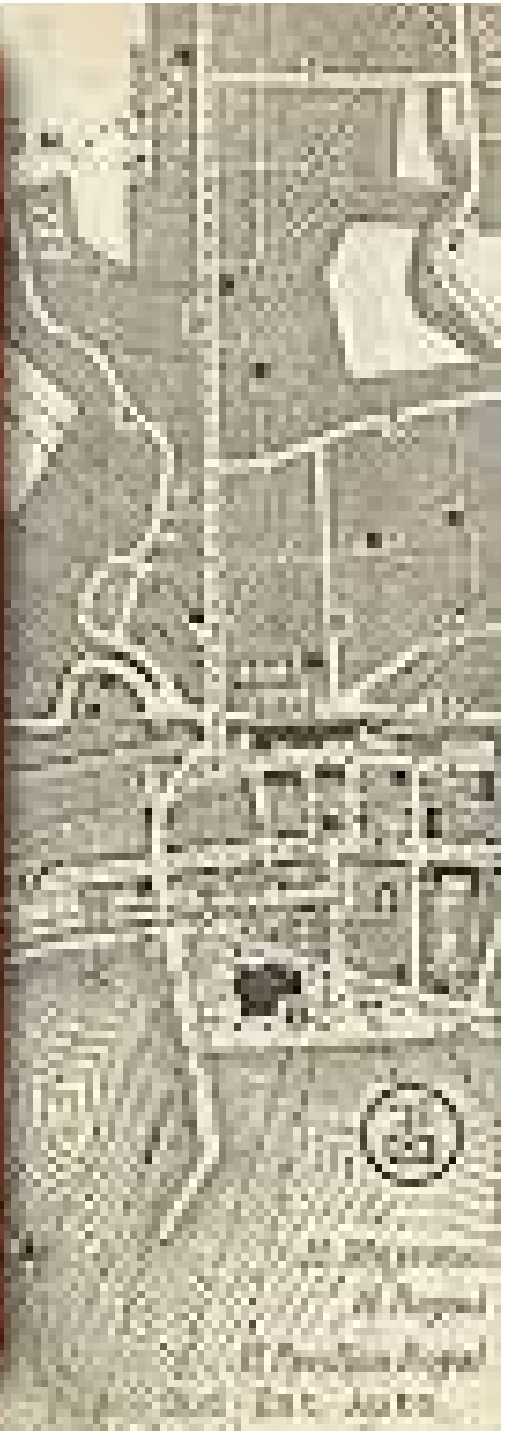
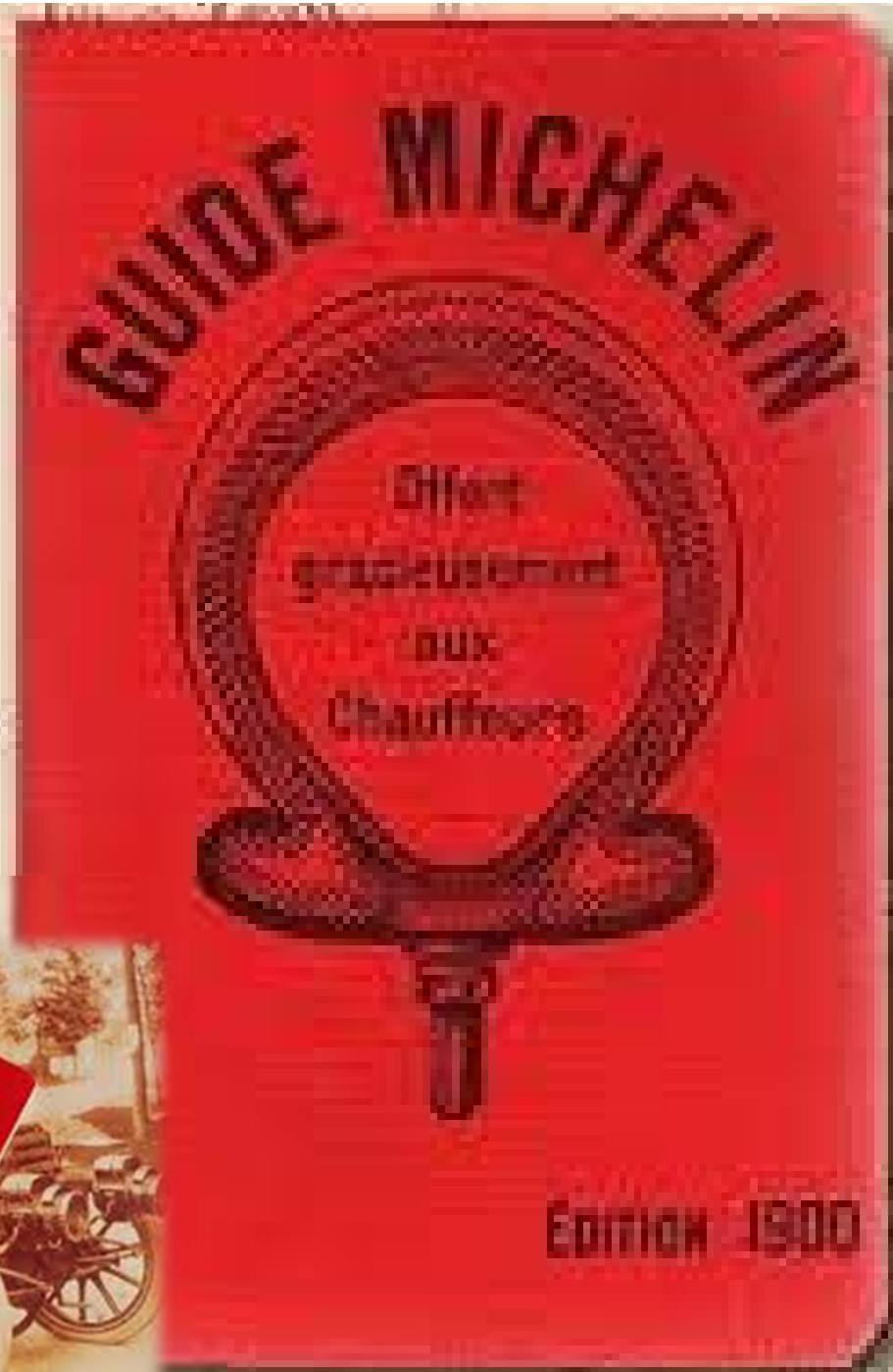
